Our mission is to promote social justice and advance basic rights for vulnerable people in our community.



Today, long overdue conversations about equity are becoming more common and widespread. At Legal Aid, our work pursuing equal justice under the law for all, regardless of race, ethnicity, gender, age, economic, or social status, has always been rooted in equity. Recognizing that the playing field has been systematically unequal for centuries, true justice seeks to right this imbalance of power and opportunity.

Over the past year, we have upheld these values by helping over 792 people hold onto their housing, 1,554 people stand up to abuse, and 966 people leverage over \$3,332,750 million to help pay for housing, food, and health care.

Because of your support, today there are veterans and seniors living at home rather than in institutions, and there are children sleeping in their beds, rather than in cars. This report touches on a few of those successes, a testament to what is possible when committed staff, board members, and donors come together to advance equity and justice in Sonoma County.

Personal Health & Safety Income Maintenance Housing Stability

Child Abuse Prevention Program (CAPP)

Helps non-parental caregivers obtain legal guardianship to protect children from abuse and neglect.

Disaster Relief Program (DRP)

Helps community members impacted by the wildfires and COVID19 access relief aid and support.

Elder Law Program (ELDER)

Helps seniors protect themselves from abuse, obtain public benefits, and preserve their housing.

Employment & Health Program (EHP)

Assists people in addressing legal barriers to employment or better health.

Homelessness Prevention Program (HPP)

Helps homeless community members remove legal barriers to access housing.

Housing Stability Program (HOME)

Helps with evictions, housing vouchers, and issues affecting safe and healthy housing.

Veterans' Benefits Program

Helps veterans obtain financial, housing, and health benefits.

Medical Legal Partnership


Provides legal assistance to address the health needs of patients.

Violence Prevention Program (SAFE)


Helps those facing violence with protective orders and other legal remedies.

Legal Aid reached over **4,450** community members via outreach presentations and legal clinics.




CALLS RECEIVED

"Iden and Ella were uprooted when they lost their home in the 2017 fires. They are very low income seniors with no other assets and were underinsured. To make matters worse, when it came time to rebuild their manufactured home, the contractor took their \$124,000 deposit and did virtually no work. Ida and Ella had no way of paying for an attorney, no home, and were about to lose their limited savings. Legal Aid intervened and forced the unlawful contractor to return the deposit.
