

KNOW YOUR RIGHTS!

Petaluma Tenant Protection Ordinance

Petaluma City Council adopted a permanent tenant protection ordinance effective on June 15.

Did you receive a notice?

Every tenant in Petaluma should receive a written notice about this ordinance and their rights-regardless of whether it applies to their tenancy

Exemption:

The ordinance protections do not apply if the landlord owns <u>3</u> or fewer rental units within the City of Petaluma, under some circumstances

How are tenants protected?

- 1. Tenants cannot be evicted unless the landlord is doing so under one of the "just cause" reasons allowed for in the ordinance
 - a. Expiration of the lease is not a "just cause" and is not grounds for eviction
- 2. Protections apply starting at <u>Day 1</u> of a tenancy
- 3. Coverage includes:
 - a. Single-family homes
 - b. Government/non-profit subsidized housing
 - c. Newly constructed units
- 4. Relocation assistance for no-fault evictions is the lesser of
 - 2.5 months worth of rent or \$9,000
- 5. All building types are covered, including single-family homes
- 6. Newly constructed units are covered

Please note:

- 1. The permanent ordinance is less protective than the temporary ordinance as follows:
 - a. For the following "no-fault" just cause evictions, the tenant is only given a right to re-rent if the unit is placed back on the rental market within the first 6 months:
 - i. Withdrawal from the rental market (Ellis Act)
 - ii. Owner/owner's family member move in
 - iii. Intent to demolish/Substantial model
 - iv. Government order
 - b. It removes the prior ban on evictions of educators and households with school-aged children during the school year
 - c. It creates a small property exemption for owners of three or fewer units, as long as they are not a business entity
